FREE GUIDED TOUR TO BE OFFERED DAILY AT THE MUSEUM OF ALABAMA THIS SUMMER

Beginning Saturday, **June 21, 2014** and extending through Labor Day weekend, a daily guided tour will be offered to the public at the Museum of Alabama, located at the Alabama Department of Archives and History. This **free, hour-long** tour will begin at **1pm Monday - Saturday**. No pre-registration is required. Join one of our experienced docents as they guide you through Alabama's past, highlighting incredible artifacts, images, and documents and answering your questions along the way.

The Museum of Alabama is the only destination where you can explore Alabama's story from prehistory to the present. Permanent exhibitions at the Museum of Alabama include *The Land of Alabama*, introducing the geology and natural resources that helped shape the state's history, and *The First Alabamians*, featuring artifacts, murals, and a diorama that tell the inspiring story of fourteen thousand years of Native American culture. A new centerpiece exhibition called *Alabama Voices* recently opened in February. This exhibition covers the dramatic unfolding of Alabama history from the dawn of the 1700s to the beginning of the 21st century. The Museum also provides interactive educational resources for children and families in the *Hands-On-Gallery* and *Grandma's Attic*.

The Museum of Alabama is located at the Alabama Department of Archives and History in downtown Montgomery, across the street from the State Capitol. The museum is open Monday – Saturday, 8:30 – 4:30. Admission is always FREE! For more information call 334-242-4364 and visit www.museum.alabama.gov.
